On the knife's edge of poverty.

Amy works two low-paying jobs trying to make ends meet but she and Frankie barely make it from paycheck to paycheck. With the high cost of housing, childcare, and health care, it's hard for them to get ahead.

When her car won't start, Amy sometimes walks to work but by the time she gets Frankie to childcare, she's late for her job.

She lives with the constant strain of losing her income – and the home that she is barely able to maintain. Making just a little above the federal cutoff to qualify for assistance, like food stamps and WIC, Amy constantly struggles just to stay afloat.

One home repair or modest health crisis can easily push them over the edge into full-blown poverty and homelessness.

Like many local families, Amy and Frankie are **ALICE households** (**A**sset-**L**imited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, (but) **E**mployed).

To complicate matters further, substance misuse and mental health issues often make a difficult situation worse when things begin to spiral out of control.

Your support of United Way helps Amy and Frankie, and other ALICE families, from falling into poverty and homelessness.

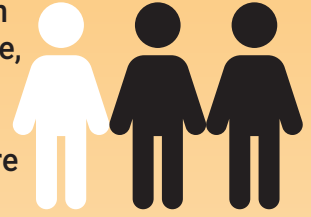
